Before you start packing, ask these questions

- What am I going to be doing on the holiday?

- Will I have international and domestic flights?
- How many carriers will I be on?
- How much luggage can I take?

Create your CAPSULE wardrobe

- Stick to an easy mix and match colour palette
- Select garments that are going to work together
- Accessories will help to take your garment from day to night
- Think about how many shoes you need to take
- Packing for a resort style holiday is totally different to a major city holiday.
- Dress comfortably and stylishly while traveling there; consider the fabrics.
- Think about the style of bag you will be carrying each day. You don't want to have a back ache at the end of the day.
- Try on, and take photos of, each outfit you create to eliminate wardrobe malfunction each day.
- You want to look stylish and comfortable, not like a tourist.

HERE IS AN EXAMPLE OF A 14 DAY HOLIDAY CAPSULE WARDROBE.

- 6 Tops
- 4 Bottoms
- 3 Pairs of shoes
- 3 Layers
 - Jacket
 - Or if going somewhere hot drop 2 layers and add extra 2 tops or 2 bottoms

- 2 Dresses convert from day to night by switching shoes and accessories
- 4 Accessories
- The key to a successful capsule wardrobe is staying within a colour palette.

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LET'S COMPARE THE DIFFERENT PACKING METHODS TO USE.

ROLLING

- Saves on space
- Prevent wrinkling,
- If staying somewhere for more than four days, unpack and hang

FOLDING

- Appears neater
- The preferred method when using the compressing packing cells.

HOW TO FOLD

- **Easy Wrinkle** (shirts, linen)
 - o fold the sleeves back
 - then fold the shirt in half vertically
 - then fold in thirds horizontally.

• Evening Wear

- fold in half horizontally
- wrap with tissue paper
- place on flat on top of everything

Jackets/ Blazers

- o fold the sleeves back.
- fold in half vertically
- then in half horizontally if needed
- then place on top.

Rolling

Use the rolling and packing cells to save space and prevent wrinkles.



EVERYTHING IS ACCESSIBLE!

PACKING CELLS

- Keep your garments organised with labelling
- Very convenient especially for multi destination holidays
- Your bag stays organised no mess when you are digging through your suitcase.
- Large packing cell are placed on the bottom, then small and lighter on top.

SHOES, ACCESSORIES & OTHER

- Packed in shoe bags
- Small articles can be stuffed into your shoes
- This helps keep your shoes in shape and small things safe.

TOILETRIES

If you're a frequent traveler keep this toiletries bag packed and ready to go.

- Sort and prepack prior to packing your suitcase
- Minimize what you take as most hotels provide body wash, shampoo and conditioner
- Use zip lock bags for opened hotel toiletries in use.
